- Full-length papers should not exceed 10,000 words and should not include endnotes or footnotes.
- English Papers: Typed in Microsoft Word, Times New Roman. Title: 16 pt bold. Main Headings: 14 pt bold. Sub-headings: 12 pt bold. Body text: 12 pt, 1.5 line spacing, one-inch custom margin on all sides, A4 size paper.

- A brief author profile (max one page) should be submitted with the paper.
- Each article must include an impact statement of no more than 150 words.
- References/bibliography must be serialized (e.g., 1, 2, 3...).
- Please include your ORCID in your article, ORCID is mandatory for each author.
- You must check grammar using the review tab in MS Word before submission.

Journal Papers should focus on empirical data, experimental methodologies, and targeted case studies.

Book Chapters must focus on conceptual frameworks, comprehensive literature reviews, historical pedagogical analyses, policy critiques, or systematic domain mappings.

Chapter Structure & Scope

- All chapters must be original, unpublished, and possess a similarity index (plagiarism) of less than 10% via Turnitin.
- Conceptual chapters, theoretical model designs, systemic literature reviews, and detailed pedagogical case studies are welcome.
- Chapters must be comprehensive, spanning between 3,500 to 6,000 words (including references, tables, and figures).

Formatting & Style Guide (English & Hindi)

To ensure smooth indexing, all authors must follow a unified format:



- **English Manuscripts:** Must be submitted in Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx) using Times New Roman.
 - *Chapter Title:* 16 pt, Bold, Centered.
 - *Main Headings:* 14 pt, Bold, Left-aligned.
 - *Sub-headings:* 12 pt, Bold-Italic.
 - *Body Text:* 12 pt, 1.5 line spacing, 1-inch custom margins on all sides.
- **Hindi Manuscripts:** Must be submitted in Microsoft Word using Unicode font.
 - *Chapter Title:* 16 pt, Bold.
 - *Headings:* 14 pt, Bold.
 - *Body Text:* 14 pt, 1.5 line spacing, 1-inch margins.
- **Citations & References:** Authors must use the APA 7th Edition referencing style. All in-text citations must be perfectly cross-referenced with the final bibliography.
- Each author must provide their full name, institutional affiliation, official email address, a brief 100-word biography, and a mandatory ORCID iD.

Review & Publication Process

- Every submitted chapter will undergo a rigorous double-blind peer-review process managed by the ICERT US review committee.
- The edited volume will be published by ICERT Press and will be allocated a unique International Standard Book Number (ISBN) for physical and digital editions.
- Authors will receive a high-resolution PDF soft copy of their published chapter and the complete book volume layout and DOI for each chapter.
